Beloved Friends and Supporters of MEEI,

One more time we are invited to prepare the Birth of the Prince of Peace. Indeed, he was born once, and he will not be born again, but we, human beings, we the believers in Christ, are invited to get ready to be born in Christ and to let Christ be born in us



We have been instructed to prepare for the

birth of Christ in Bethlehem, which can be an act outside our own self. I think Christ, the King of Glory, is ready to be born in our lives, in our thoughts, in our actions. Are we ready to welcome him as "the grotto of the Nativity" did? As the shepherds did? As the Magi did? Yes, it's to us to be ready to welcome Christ not as outsider guest, but to welcome him and to be clothed with him, so that he grows, and we diminish. This is the kind of Christmas I wish you all.

I wish you to be a smile of hope around you, a smile to your community, a smile for your brothers and sisters, for those who are close by, and those who are far away. Humanity needs presently more than ever than before: The witness we are responsible to spread around without any restriction.

I want on behalf of all our faculty members, our students, children or adult, and on behalf of myself to wish you the courage and the Grace of God to let the Prince of Peace become alive in you.




